**Jeanne M. David, Ph.D.**  
**Associate Professor of Accounting**  
**College of Business Administration**  
**University of Detroit Mercy**

Dr. Jeanne David is an associate professor of accounting and the accounting discipline coordinator. She joined Detroit Mercy, in 1988, thus is completing her 30th year here. Throughout all of her 30 years, she has been an accounting student academic advisor and the primary accounting advisor for the majority of those years. She was the business manager and undergraduate director for the College for a number of years, which expanded her advising to students in business administration, as well as accounting. She has published in the areas of pedagogy, ethics, financial accounting, cost accounting topics, and has worked with publishers in reviewing textbooks and preparing supplements. She is a member of the American Accounting Association,

the Michigan Accounting Association, and the Institute of Management Accountants. She has served on national committees of the American Accounting Association, is a past national director of the Institute of Management Accountants, and served as a director of its Michigan Council, and past president of its Oakland County Chapter. With Dr. Fang (Rose) Yang, she is co-advisor to the Beta Alpha Psi, Alpha Xi Chapter. She has been active in service to the College and to the university by serving on a variety of committees, participating in events, and providing support at activities across the university. She has served as a college representative to the McNichols Faculty Assembly, and has been a member of the board and on the executive committee of the University of Detroit Mercy Professors' Union. She has worked as a volunteer providing free tax services under VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) since the early 1990's and several years ago was asked to take the lead in the VITA program here at Detroit Mercy. For the last four years, she was recognized as the VITA champion by the Accounting Aid Society, and the College has been recognized for its service by the City of Detroit each year. Last year alone, the students and other volunteers at Detroit Mercy were able to help return over \$100,000 to local community residents through this program. It is estimated that these residents saved about \$30,000 in tax service fees. She is also active in community organizations and church organizations. She is the treasurer for a local community group, an active committee member and lector at her Church. Dr. David received her bachelor's degree from University of Lowell (now, U Mass - Lowell), and her M.B.A. and Ph.D. from Texas A&M University.
